About the Course

This course has been developed to provide culturally practical tools and techniques to assist formal and informal Mentors. It will assist you to support Aboriginal employees to see possibilities, problem solve and retain employment. Mentoring in a cultural context is a vital skill to develop and the benefits to a Mentor-Mentee relationship can be rewarding for individuals and organisation.

Who delivers? The course is delivered by experienced Aboriginal Mentors. The course has been developed, designed and will be delivered by an experienced Aboriginal Mentor.

Who can attend? Anyone who is directly or indirectly involved in working with or mentoring Aboriginal employees. This course is for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous participants who have life experience and knowledge.

How long? We need 5 days to deliver, assess three (3) units of training. This may be delivered as 3 days then 2 days or delivered as 5 consecutive days. There will be take-home activities to complete as part of training and we encourage people to complete most of their assignments and assessments during class-time.

Which 3 units?

1. INDMEN001 Mentor Indigenous workers for job retention.
2. CHCDIV001 Work with diverse people.
3. CHCCOM002 Use communications to build relationships.

What will I receive once competent? A Statement of Attainment for the three units.

Is this cross-cultural training? No. This course will provide you with practical skills, tips and techniques to use with Aboriginal employees and trainees in a cross-cultural workplace setting. It will assist you to operate in a cultural security context.

How will I be assessed? The assessment book has case studies, questions, role-plays and research activities. Participants will undertake two (2) supervised mentor sessions.
